The updated FAFSA is now accessible; however, it is not without its challenges. These issues are likely to result in delays to the typical timeline colleges adhere to when communicating financial aid packages for accepted students. If you encounter any problems, we strongly advise that you:

- Take a break and try again later.

A Reminder About Mid-Year Grades (for seniors)

Many colleges request updated grades for seniors who have not yet received an admissions decision. This may include a formal mid-year report/transcript or an update to your SRAR. The mid-year grades are an average of the first and second marking period grades from this year. In addition, we also update both your senior year and cumulative GPAs.

- Mid-year reports/transcripts will be sent by your counselor to all colleges during the first week of February. These are sent automatically-students do not need to make a formal request.
- Please be aware that if you were required to complete a Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) for any of your colleges (Rutgers is an example), you may be required to update that document with your mid-year grades. Please check the student portal for those colleges and if it needs to be updated, stop by the guidance office during the first week of February to pick up your mid-year transcript.
